## It's Turtle Season Again!

(March 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>)



## Please help our endangered sea turtles nest successfully! Lights:

- Turn-off lights or close blinds on ocean facing windows on ALL floors where windows are visible from the beach
- Exterior lighting visible from the beach should be shielded to cast light down to the ground & use red or amber LED bulbs (which are less disruptive to turtles at night)
- **Do not use flashlights**, lanterns or flash photography on the beach at night.



## On the Beach:

- Play in the sand and build castles, BUT before you leave, **fill in the holes & knock down the castles**! (Holes, moats & castles can either prevent hatchlings from making it to the ocean, or hold them up, increasing their chances of being eaten by crabs, birds & raccoons)
- Remove all furniture, toys umbrellas, etc. at night
- Avoid digging holes above the high water point in the sand. This is where turtles nest. Holes in the beach at night can discourage females from nesting
- Do not go out looking for a sea turtle at night, your presence can disturb nesting sea turtles
